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Theme of the 2025 edition

between worlds, creating a space where multivers meet and intertwine. It's a fertile ground for exchange and hybridity, where contrasts - land and sea, high and low, visible and invisible, living human and non-human, past and present - don't work in opposition to each other, but merge in a continuous movement to give birth to a 'third space'.

A landscape woven of blue and green, caught between the movement of the waves and the hieratic presence of the summits. an in-between emerges a crossroads: where singular forces and distinct universes converge. Here, every gap becomes a promise of transformation, a place where the tangible meets the imaginary, where the earth ventures towards the sea, and where the high rises towards the low. Blue and green don't merge into each other; their interaction creates a creative tension, a vibrant frontier of richness akin to an ecotone where the multiplicity of universes coexist in constant dialogue, generating new forms in the flow of transitions towards new imaginations.

These **common interstices** are both places of convergence and divergence: they **separate** and **connect**, they juxtapose and weave.

They invite us to cross borders without ever erasing them.

Like a gully that cuts through the Earth to reach the Ocean, they embody continuity as much as discontinuity, passage as much as threshold.

This edition is a call to inhabit these interstices, as open-air laboratories, liminal spaces of experimentation to imagine and embody contrasts by combining them.

In the context of this festival, the artists are **the architects of a new collective narrative**, capable of uniting imaginations, transforming territories and weaving links between worlds that are sometimes opposed. By embracing these zones of hybridity and exchange, they offer keys to a better way of living in a changing world, by creating works that connect, repair and inspire.

By cultivating spaces of resistance and resilience, artists are not just witnesses to change: they become its actors and transmitters.

As creators of passages and revelators of interconnections, they are invited to deploy practices that are at once somatic, sensory or spiritual, and the skills of the hand and the earth.

These creations draw on **deep roots**, implanted in the past and traditions, while at the same time reaching out towards new perspectives.

They offer the viewer an immersive experience, taking them symbolically, or physically, through this in-between world, feeling both the anchor from below and the aspiration from above. The artist acts as a guide to these transformations and encounters, giving shape to the material and materiality to the forms, revealing the hidden potential of the interstices.

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Definitions

Third Space

The concept of Third Space originates from cultural and social theories, notably those developed by the anthropologist and philosopher Edward Soja and the postcolonial theorist Homi K. Bhabha. The concept refers to hybrid spaces where different cultures, ideas and perspectives come together, creating spaces for negotiation, innovation and transformation.

Ecotone

In ecology, an ecotone is the transition zone between two different ecosystems, such as the edge between a forest and a meadow. This area is often very rich in biodiversity, as it combines the characteristics of both environments while generating its own dynamics.

Blue/green

The green and blue grid (TVB) is an ecological planning concept that aims to preserve and link natural areas (forests, meadows, wetlands, watercourses) in order to maintain biodiversity. The 'green network' refers to natural land areas (such as forests and hedges), while the 'blue network' refers to aquatic environments (rivers, lakes, wetlands). The aim is to ensure connectivity between these areas so that animal and plant species can move, reproduce and survive, even in the face of urbanisation and land development.

Context

The Réunion Métis association is launching a call for artists to take part in the next edition of its festival, scheduled for 28, 29 and 30 November 2025. This call for participation is open to artists.

2.1. Réunion Métis Association

The Réunion Métis Association draws its DNA from 'living together by doing together', by promoting the cultural, ethnic and social diversity that characterises Réunion.

The association's role is to watch over and take care of Réunion's territory, promote social cohesion and forge lasting bonds. It sees itself as a facilitator of getting things done together, an intercultural facilitator, a catalyst for synergies between public and private players, and a creator of links through artistic and educational initiatives.

2.2. The Kromali Festival

The Kromali festival is a window on contemporary and urban art, celebrating the artistic wealth of Réunion and the Indian Ocean. A free, multi-disciplinary event, it transforms the urban space into a vibrant, immersive art scene. Conceived as a time for sharing and discovery, the festival brings together artists from a wide range of disciplines, offering a comprehensive panorama of contemporary creation. Installations, performances, musical scenes and artistic interventions follow one another, inviting the public to explore the many facets of Reunionese culture.

As well as putting on shows, the festival aims to make culture accessible to all,

promoting emerging talent and building bridges between communities. It also spotlights the productions from the artistic practices developed by the Association in the neighbourhoods, notably through the Réunion Métis 2024-2025 project.

Each edition is an invitation to rethink our relationship with the land, our history and our collective identity. With the ambition of becoming a major player in artistic expression in the Indian Ocean on the international scene, the Kromali Festival is much more than a cultural event: it's a living manifesto for living together.

2.3. Content of the calls for portfolio

This year, the artistic committee is launching calls for portfolio to select:

- Artistic Installations (visual artists, plastic artists, designers, video artists, architects, digital artists and sound creators, etc.)
- Street art (urban art in all its forms: graffiti artists, graphic artists, painters, photographers, poster artists, draughtsmen, sculptors and the following techniques: mosaics, stickers, etc.)
- Performances (dancers, actors, slammers, circus performers, acrobats, fonnkezers, moringueur-euse-s, poets, flash mobbing, choirs...)

For each of these categories, the selection procedures are detailed below.

Call for entriesPerformance & Street Art

Art conveys emotion and imagination, and it is with this in mind that the Réunion Métis association is organising the Kromali Festival. It invites everyone to participate in the creation of a common space, a place for sharing, meeting, exchanging and marvelling. In this sense, the works become a means of connecting people, places, ideas and experiences to create a sense of community and mutual understanding between artists and audiences.

To explore the interstices, Réunion Métis encourages co-creation and the development of interactive, participatory, immersive and transdisciplinary experiences. Projects may combine various artistic, scientific and social disciplines, creating new cross-fertilisations and dialogues between sectors. They may involve the public in advance of the festival and address social and educational dimensions, in collaboration with associations, schools and players from different backgrounds.

3.1. Disciplines seeked

Bring the streets of Saint-Paul to life over the 3 days of the 2025 festival, day and night!

The festival encourages small-scale creative work, favouring light, mobile interventions that create artistic micro-universes conducive to sensitive exploration of the interstices.

The venues will be determined in consultation with the festival's artistic committee, in line with the programme.

A mediation component proposed by the artist to facilitate understanding of the artistic approach would be a plus.

3.2. Day and night performances

The performances will have to inhabit the urban space in a poetic and committed way, and may take the form of small travelling or fixed forms, creating moments of surprise.

Performances may last between 10 and 30 minutes.

Creations can be repeated three times per evening and on all three evenings of the festival.

Who is this call for portfolios for?

This call is open to dancers, actors, circus performers, slammers, musicians, poets and performers, individually or in groups..

Examples:

- Dance performances, immersive theatre
- Street art, circus, live poetry
- Cross-disciplinary creations combining text, music and movement

3.3 Street Art - Urban Interventions

Interventions will have to reinvent walls and floors, add volume, fill in cracks and take over unusual spaces. The route offers a multitude of possibilities.

Produced during the night festival, depending on the mural projects.

Who is this call for portfolios for?

This call is open to graffiti artists, urban artists, painters, illustrators, mosaicists, poster artists and sculptors, either individually or in groups.

Exemples:

- Frescoes
- Participatory and ephemeral installations
- Poetic and committed visual messages

3.4 Support offered to selected artists

Réunion Métis will pay for:

- A fee for the production of the work/ performance
- A production budget
- A budget for travel expenses for artists from outside the Réunion region
- Facilities: administrative authorisation, logistical assistance, technical support and design assistance
- Visibility for the creations and artists:
 - in conjunction with the festival's outreach team, to promote the festival to different audiences
 - ♦ in conjunction with the festival's communications team, to raise the profile of the event during the media campaign
- Catering during installation and the festival

4.1 Selection criterias

Deadline for applications:

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The documents required for the visibility of the artistic universes and the administrative documents are compulsory for the study of the applications during the pre-selection of the applications.

Documents required:

- Portfolio
- Note of artistic intent
- Detailed budget estimate
- High-definition photos or visual aids
- Compulsory administrative documents: bank details, insurance certificate, company registration number

4.3. Is it possible to respond to several calls?

Yes, it is possible to respond to several portfolio calls.

It is also possible to respond to a portfolio call with a cross-disciplinary approach (combining installation and performance, for example).

In this case, it is not necessary to respond to the two corresponding calls for projects.
